- 1. Including assessment of perceived partner support (**PIQ-20**; Cohen & Lichtenstein, 1990) [this is assessed during Baseline and End-of-Study visits only in the current study protocol] at all participant study visits (including Enrolment, End-of-Pregnancy, and End-of-Study/Postpartum visits, as well as additional monthly assessments, if participant self-reports as quit during monthly telephone calls and attends a study visit [maximum 10]).
- 2. Including assessment of motivation (internal/external motivation for quitting as measured by the Reasons for Quitting questionnaire; **RFQ** [Curry et al., 1990]; and includes additional pregnancy questions [Curry et al., 2001]) [this is an additional assessment not included in the current study protocol] at all participant study (including Enrolment, End-of-Pregnancy, and End-of-Study/Postpartum visits, as well as additional monthly assessments, if participant self-reports as quit during monthly telephone calls and attends a study visit [maximum 10]).
- 3. Include PhD candidate Dr Mona Thorpe as a study investigator

JUSTIFICATION/REASON FOR THE CHANGES

- 1. Including assessment of perceived partner support (as measured by PIQ-20; Cohen & Lichtenstein, 1990) at all study visits will allow us to determine change in partner support over time and determine if this is related to/effects motivation to quit/actual quitting behaviour. This 20 item questionnaire should only add an additional 10 minutes to study visits.
- 2. Including a measure of motivation for quitting (as measured by the Reasons for Quitting questionnaire; **RFQ** [Curry et al., 1990]; and includes additional pregnancy questions [Curry et al., 2001]) will allow us to determine if the underlying mechanism of providing quit contingent monetary/voucher incentives acts initially as an external motivator but fosters a transition to internal motivation over time. This 24 item questionnaire should only add an additional 10 minutes to study visits.
- 3. Dr Mona Thorpe has recently commenced a PhD and is supervised by Dr Mai Frandsen and A/Prof Stuart Ferguson. Her PhD studies will focus on promoting smoking cessation in pregnancy.
