We trust that you are doing well and keeping safe.

Singapore started Phase Two of post-Circuit Breaker on 19 June 2020.

A. Principal Investigators (PIs), students, research staff and trainees may engage in the following research activities on and off campus with effect from 6 July 2020:

i. Core Curriculum Activities:

Research projects applicable to core curriculum activities*.

ii. Other Applied Research activities (not part of students' curriculum):

These projects may involve students hired under the student helper scheme, research staff, or trainees hired under the SGUnited Traineeship Programme.

Please communicate the attached guidelines to students, research staff and trainees who are part of your research team.

*Note:

- a. If the activity is not a core curriculum or can be postponed (even if it is a core curriculum) without affecting the academic progression of the student, it should be postponed until guidance is given from MOE to allow such activities.
- b. Students must be given the option to opt out if they are not comfortable to proceed with the research activity. The PI will need to explain to the students the impact on their learning progression.
- B. The following guidelines are for the safe conduct of research activities on and off SIT Campuses:

i. On SIT Campuses:

- a. Risk assessment must be conducted prior to any research activity;
- SIT's Safe Management Measures (SMM) must be adhered to;
- Approval must be sought before any research activities are conducted, from the relevant authority (e.g. students from supervisors, research staff from PI, faculty from CDs, POs from Dir, POD);
- d. Approval will be subject to capacity of work venues (lab usage requires POD approval);
- e. Research activities must not involve more than five persons per group and adhere to safe distancing measures:
- f. PIs/ students/ research staff/ trainees who are unwell, or who have household members on Home Quarantine Order/Stay Home Notice or have adult household members with flu-like symptoms such as fever and cough, are required not to engage in research activities;
